Minutes of an Assembly of Principals and Electors of the Parish of St Brelade held at the Parish Hall, St Brelade on Tuesday 23 September 2020 commencing at 19:00 hours.

**Convening
Notice:**

The Convening Notice referring to a requête under Article 9 of the Loi (1804) au Sujet des Assemblées Paroissiales was read by the Parish Secretary. A copy of the requête is attached to and forms part of this minute.

1. Introduction

Procureur du Bien Public Peter Norman introduced the topic under discussion with a presentation describing the site at La Pulente occupied by the Hideout kiosk and the terms under which it occupied its present site. He also presented some of the legal matters applicable to the meeting.

2. Karl Sutton

Mr Karl Sutton, the owner of the Hideout Kiosk described the circumstances of the kiosk and the events leading to the presentation of the requête. His hope and intention was to continue operating the kiosk on the same basis as hitherto.

**3. Stephanie
Steedman**

A representative speaking on behalf of The Shell House Limited then spoke to give a description of the proposed development of the site with a toilet block belonging to the company adjacent to the car park owned by the parish. She also described some of the surveys and works already undertaken or in progress for the site. She explained that advice had been received that it would not be safe for the Hideout kiosk to operate in the car park immediately adjacent to the proposed construction works.

**4. Discussion
from the
floor**

There followed a discussion with a number of parishioners making points or asking questions of the two previous speakers and of the Connétable. These explored the triggering events and possible courses of action including the possibility that the Hideout kiosk would relocate to a position on the road leading from the car park to the slipway.

**5. Indicative
show of
hands**

The Connétable drew the discussion to a close. He explained that, with so many unable to attend the assembly on account of the current restrictions, any vote would not be a reliable indication of the views of all who wished to attend. The views expressed at the meeting indicated a desire for the Hideout to be able to

continue trading without hindering, and until completion of, the proposed development by The Shell House Limited.

The Connétable proposed that an indicative show of hands be taken from those present to support that the Hideout kiosk be permitted to remain in its present position until such time as the planning permission came through to set up on the proposed slipway position.

This was carried by 17 for to 4 against.

In thanking everybody for their attendance, the Connétable declared the meeting closed at 21:05 hours.
