1. Minutes of previous Assembly	The Minutes of the meeting held on the 30 March 2021 in relation to Charrion Stores were presented to the meeting. The Connétable asked the meeting if they would like these read and Mr Peter Norman proposed that they were accepted as read and Mr Arthur Morley seconded that.
2. Application for 5th Category (Club) Liquor Licence – Royal Channel Islands Yacht Club	<p>The Connétable read Item 2 of the Convening Act to consider a Representation from the Royal Channel Islands Yacht Club in respect of their 5th Category (Club) Liquor Licence, to extend the said licence to cover an external area for the temporary use for Alfresco Dining and asked if a representative of the Royal Channel Islands Yacht Club would like to outline their application.</p> <p>Mr James Wilding took the floor and explained that he wished to be able to erect a marquee on the parking area in front of their establishment for use during their Annual Regatta and also as an outside alfresco area similar to that arrangement they used during Covid.</p> <p>The application was proposed by Mr Jeremy Edmund Swetenham and seconded by Ms Maria Louise Hall.</p> <p>The Connétable thanked Mr Wilding and asked the floor if there were any questions. There being none, the Connétable asked all those in favour to raise their hand. It was noted that 12 attendees were in favour. The Connétable asked if anyone was against. No hands were raised. The Application was passed by 12 votes to none.</p>
3(i). Application for 6th Category (off) Licence 74 Mont es Croix, La rue de la Pointe JE3 8EN	Turning to Item 3 on the Convening Act, the Connétable read the Application submitted by Rustic Jersey Limited in relation to an application for 6 th Category (Off) Licence. The Connétable asked who was presenting this application and Mr Nixon took to the floor. He explained that he and his wife ran an events company. They had moved from St Joh to St Brelade and needed to have their new location re elected to their Licence. The Connétable asked for the

The Connétable asked if the applicant would like to explain to the meeting the purpose of their application.</p> <p>Mr Le Riche said that they wished to showcase craft beers which they will be selling to various establishments. They were from some of the best that the UK has to offer at present.</p> <p>Mr Peter Norman asked if any products would be stored on “the premises” and Mr Le Riche said no, it was hoped that as soon as the orders arrived they would be delivered very shortly thereafter. The orders would be placed on a monthly basis.</p> <p>The Connétable asked for the Proposer and Seconder to show themselves and Miss Katherine Moon proposed the application and Mr Benjamin Renouf seconded the application.</p> <p>The Connétable asked for a show of hands in favour of the application, 12 hands were in favour and no one was against the application. The application was unanimously passed.</p>
