PARISH ASSEMBLY

	Minutes of an Assembly of Principals and Electors of the Parish of St Brelade held at St Brelade's Parish Hall on Tuesday 30 July 2024 commencing at 19:35 hours.
President of Assembly:	Connétable M K Jackson, presided.
Convening Notice:	The Convening Notice was read by the Parish Secretary.
1. Minutes of Previous Assembly:	The Minutes of the previous Assembly of Principals and Electors of The Parish of St Brelade held on 16 July 2024, were adopted and signed following a proposal by Mr Alan Breckon which was seconded by Mr Peter Norman with all in favour.
2. Consider application by 1888 Consulting Limited to obtain a P49 Annual Entertainment Licence for the premises Grace's (formerly Sugareef):	<p>The Connétable invited Advocate Beverley Lacey from Viberts Law firm to address the Assembly. She stated her clients were looking at providing a pleasant dining experience with no wild music in two proposed areas, one on the ground floor and one area upstairs. She advised if the P49 was granted the Bailiff would apply two conditions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• There shall be noise covered by the P49 only twice a week during the licence period.• After 11 pm the noise covered by the P49 shall be such that it is not audible at the nearest noise sensitive receptor. <p>These conditions were agreed with the applicant.</p> <p>Deputy Jonathan Renouf asked for confirmation that music would be played when dining and not for events and if the doors would be open.</p> <p>Advocate Lacey was unable to give a definitive answer but would advise her clients.</p> <p>Centenier Michel Bougeard advised of the Law for no amplified music on the beach and should not be audible from outside the building.</p> <p>Advocate Lacey responded saying she would relay to her clients that noise to be kept to a minimum.</p> <p>Mr Arthur Morley, Procureur du Bien Public, expressed concern for the adjacent hotel residents trying to sleep.</p>

	<p>Mr Edward Burns stated other hotels and restaurants had licences and the former Sugar Reef had always provided music. Centenier Bougeard commented that they had previously had speakers outside.</p> <p>The Connétable read the Fire Service report which forms part of these Minutes.</p> <p>Mr Edward Burns proposed and Mrs Clare Burns seconded and a vote was taken with 11 in favour and 1 against the proposition.</p> <p>The Connétable advised that all people who had spoken in the Assembly were able to voice their concerns.</p>


- Any siting of the entertainment equipment of stands does not encroach on dedicated means of escape.
- The storage cupboard on the ground floor can not be used if the proposed siting of an entertainer is situated adjacent to it.

OCCUPANCY:

The occupancy has been assessed at:

220 persons total (Ground floor – 110 persons, First floor 110 persons)
7 persons is to be deducted for each entertainment area used.
