

**PARISH OF ST BRELADE**

**PARISH ASSEMBLY**

	Minutes of an Assembly of Principals and Electors of the Parish of St Brelade held at St Brelade's Parish Hall on Tuesday 26 November 2024 commencing at 19:00 hours.
<b>President of Assembly:</b>	Connétable M K Jackson, presided.
<b>Convening Notice:</b>	The Convening Notice was read by the Parish Secretary.
<b>1. Minutes of Previous Assembly:</b>	The Minutes of the previous Assembly of Principals and Electors of The Parish of St Brelade held on 24 September 2024, were adopted unanimously after a note of an error on the 2 <sup>nd</sup> page, the split should read as £30,000 to parish and £10,000 to Rectorat making £40,000 and signed following a proposal by Deputy Moz Scot which was seconded by Mr Stephen Pallett with all in favour.
<b>2. In accordance with Article 5(1) of the Licensing (Jersey) Law, 1974 as amended, Application for 6<sup>th</sup> Category Licence by Royal Mash Vodka :</b>	<p>The Chairman invited Mrs Rachel De Caen the Company Secretary of Royal Mash Vodka to address the assembly. Mrs De Caen advised she was moving her business from St Helier to St Brelade.</p> <p>The Connétable asked if there was sufficient storage and parking facilities at the new Castle Coombe address, which was confirmed by Mrs De Caen.</p> <p>There being no further questions and following a proposal from Mrs Wendy Swanson and seconded by Mr David Swanson a vote was taken with 13 in favour and nil against.</p>
<b>3. Consider and approve, if necessary, application for an Annual P49 Licence by St Brelade Sports &amp; Social Club:</b>	<p>The Chairman invited Mrs Kirsten Kilby to address the assembly regarding the application for an annual P49 for the St Brelade Sports and Social Club.</p> <p>Mrs Kilby advised they wanted to apply for an Annual Permit rather than monthly permits for their events.</p> <p>Deputy Moz Scott asked about the proposed frequency of the events.</p> <p>Mrs Kilby advised they anticipated one event per month in the summer and two per month during the winter period.</p> <p>There being no further questions a vote was taken with 17 votes in favour and none against.</p>
